Automobile driving, at times, is extremely irritating and stressful. It may even evoke aggressive behavior. However, a preventative measure to reduce stressful situations during driving an automobile is to listen to one's favorite music collection. Musical therapy has been shown to reduce stress and blood pressure as well as enhance relaxation, thus alleviating driver stress. According to Wiesenthal et al. music is an important mechanism in coping with driver stress. Yet, the impact of music is unnoticed during low traffic congestion scenarios. The researchers studied commuters in two types of scenarios: when listening to one's favorite music and when traveling in silence. During both conditions driver stress significantly increased during high congestion traffic compared to low. Nevertheless, during the silence situation, driver stress increased significantly more in high congestion traffic as opposed to the music condition. During high congestion, music exposure seemed to have a soothing effect on driver stress.

Educators can take advantage of trusted networks to engage students and help them learn important skills and concepts. Free radicals damage DNA, and sometimes this damage leads to development of cancer. In laboratory cell cultures and animal studies, antioxidants appear to slow the development of cancer. The results have been mixed in studies where humans took antioxidant dietary supplements. A large study of 29,000 men showed that when a beta-carotene dietary supplement was taken by men who smoked, they developed lung cancer at a rate 18% higher and died at a rate 8% higher than men who did not receive the supplement. Another study that gave men dietary supplements of beta-carotene and vitamin A was stopped when researchers found the men receiving the beta-carotene had a 46% greater chance of dying from lung cancer than those who did not receive the supplement. Other large studies have shown either no or only slight protective effects against cancer. The position of the American Cancer Society, the National Cancer Institute, and several international health organizations is that antioxidants should come from a healthy diet high in fruits and vegetables and low in fat and not from dietary supplements.

Creating this kind of behavior change is necessary for employers if they wish to reduce the overall costs associated with obesity and related conditions, as well as positively impact the lives of individual employees. The opportunity to make these savings has increased since the introduction of the Affordable Care Act which has significantly changed the landscape of health care in the U.S. Research suggests that simply communicating objective information about health-risks is not enough. A successful workplace wellness program must take account of the complex and dynamic factors that influence how people behave when it comes to health-related decisions.

So when you recall the summer vacation when you first learned to swim or row a boat, it feels endless. But this is merely an illusion, the way adults understand the past when they look through the telescope of lost time. This, though, is not an illusion: almost all of us faced far steeper learning curves when we were young. Most adults do not explore and learn about the world the way they did when they were young; adult life lacks the constant discovery and endless novelty of childhood. Studies have shown that the greater the cognitive demands of a task, . Dr. David Eagleman at Baylor College of Medicine found that repeated stimuli appear briefer in duration than novel stimuli of

with the other species they eat, and very often a relationship of interdependence develops: I'll feed you if you spread around my genes. A gradual process of mutual adaptation transforms something like an apple or a squash into a nutritious and tasty food for a hungry animal. Over time and through trial and error, the plant becomes tastier (and often more conspicuous) in order to gratify the animal's needs and desires, while the animal gradually acquires whatever digestive tools (enzymes, etc.) are needed to make optimal use of the plant. Similarly, cow's milk did not start out as a nutritious food for humans; in fact, it made them sick until humans who lived around cows evolved the ability to digest lactose as adults. This development proved much to the advantage of both the milk drinkers and the cows.
